In this position, I also facilitated orientation, reflection, and education events, and overall increased both volunteer and community partner participation.

- Director of the Food & Housing Security & Sovereignty Team *Spring 2023 – Fall 2024*
  - As the Director of the Food & Housing Security & Sovereignty Team under MOSAIC, I led bi-weekly meetings of the team and organized team campus-wide education events. This position taught me leadership skills, event planning, and effective communication. In the Fall of 2024, we executed an engagement event that provided 600 snack bags, one for every single student at Paxinosa Elementary School. My team and I utilized solely donations and volunteer efforts to fill snack bags with over 5 different types of snacks for the students in a time where budget cuts rescinded afterschool programming and food bags. This event was so successful that in the Fall of 2025, the team under new amazing leadership was able to duplicate and increase the scope of the event to provide snacks to both March Elementary School and Paxinosa Elementary School.
  
- Pard Projects Program Coordinator *Spring 2023 – Fall 2024*
  - The Pard Projects program facilitates one-time and large-scale engagement opportunities in the Easton area. As a program coordinator for this team, I worked with organizations on campus to increase volunteer engagement and maintain long-term relationships with the community. I assisted with two incredible Holiday Helpers gift drives as well as the Rivalry Blood Drive. Through this position, I led groups to one-time events including Amanda Miner Library Cleanup, Heart Making Event, Heart Hanging Event, Connected Classrooms Tours, 3 Cheston Elementary School Fall Fests, 3 Cheston Elementary School Math & Reading Nights, Lafapalooza YMCA Cleanup, and the West Ward Market.
  
- MOSAIC Leadership Coordinator *Spring 2025 – Present*
  - As MLC, I lead a team of 15 program coordinators in support of 13 weekly community engagement programs in Easton and the surrounding areas. I lead bi-weekly full staff meetings, including leadership development workshops, education event preparation, individualized program assistance, and more. In this position, I am grateful to say that my team and I successfully organized an education event with eight influential

members of the Lehigh Valley community to bridge the gap in the conversation about the ongoing Pennsylvania Budget Impasse. We facilitated vital discussions about what it meant, why it mattered, and how it affected our local schools and nonprofit organizations. This event connected Lafayette to Easton in a way that has never been done before, and allowed community partners to truly see the impact that we as a campus want to have with our community. We are consistently increasing and diversifying volunteer engagement, as well as our education and reflection impacts. It was important to me in this position to increase volunteer and program coordinator perspectives on quality community engagement, highlighting the “why” behind our efforts in our beloved community.

- Peer Education Team
  - Program Coordinator *Spring 2025 – Present*
    - As a coordinator for the Peer Education Team, my fellow coordinators and I helped build this brand new team to create and facilitate training modules and workshops that align with the Landis Center’s mission and values, helping students understand the principles of ethical engagement, cultural responsibility, and reciprocal partnership. Through peer-led instruction, we serve as a bridge between campus and community, ensuring students are equipped with the knowledge and context needed before engaging with off-campus partners.
  
- Attendance Ambassador
  - Program Coordinator *Fall 2025 – Present*
    - This pilot program provides individual care for students at Paxinosa Elementary School struggling with chronic absenteeism. My position allows me to run weekly programming with small groups of students, alongside another program coordinator, and work closely to provide advice and attendance improvement strategies. I had the chance to bring this program to Lafayette with our incredible community partners at Paxinosa.

#### Alpha Phi Sorority

- Director of Philanthropy *Jan – Dec 2024*
  - As the Director of Philanthropy, I planned over 13 individual fundraising events, ran weekly programming at the Children’s Home of Easton, facilitated relationships with other organizations on campus, organized clearance and quality community engagement workshops, and increased our chapter’s engagement

hours from 5 hours per member each semester to 10 hours on average per semester. In my time as Director of Philanthropy, our chapter raised about \$20,000 in support of the Alpha Phi Foundation for women's heart health. For our engagement and philanthropic efforts, Alpha Phi was given the Panhellenic Excellence in Community Service and Philanthropy Award. This position gave me the opportunity to work closely with new community partners, and organizations on campus.

- Volunteer at the Children's Home of Easton *Fall 2023 – Present*
  - One of my favorite aspects about being in Alpha Phi is our bi-weekly engagement at the Children's Home of Easton. We get to spend time with an inspiring group of girls and get to know them and their interests. Around Halloween, we fundraise to provide them with costumes of their choosing and do a fashion show to see their beautiful costumes.
